A Real Christmas Requires Remembering Why Christ Came

Advent marks the start of a new Church Year. We begin at the end, watching Jesus ride into Jerusalem on a donkey colt, knowing full well that he would be killed before the end of the week. The events of Palm Sunday serve as a microcosm for all Jesus' work, proving the Son of God was willing to humble himself and endure anything for our salvation. That is precisely why Christ came. And a real Christmas requires remembering why Christ came.

M: We wait in hope for the LORD; he is our help and our shield.


C: In him our hearts rejoice, for we trust in his holy name.

M: May your unfailing love be with us, LORD, even as we put our hope in you (Ps 33:20-23)

- M: Have mercy on me, O God, according to your unfailing love;
- C: according to your great compassion blot out my transgressions
- M: Blessed is the one whose transgressions are forgiven, whose sins are covered. (Ps 51:1-2; 32:1)
- M: If you, LORD, kept a record of sins, Lord, who could stand?
- C: But with you there is forgiveness, so that we can, with reverence, serve you.
- M: I wait for the LORD, my whole being waits, and in his word I put my hope. (Ps 130:3-5)



- M: I wait for the Lord more than watchmen wait for the morning, more than watchmen wait for the morning.
- C: Israel, put your hope in the LORD, for with the LORD is unfailing love and with him is full redemption.
- M: He himself will redeem Israel from all their sins.

(Ps 130:6-8)

- M: My heart is not proud, LORD, my eyes are not haughty; I do not concern myself with great matters or things too wonderful for me
- C: But I have calmed and quieted myself, I am like a weaned child with its mother; like a weaned child I am content.
- M: Israel, put your hope in the LORD both now and forevermore.

(Ps 131)

Lighting of the Advent Candle

- **M:** We light one Advent candle, remembering Jesus who is coming again. He will come to gather his people from everywhere, both the living and the dead.
- C: We remember Jesus who will come at the end of time. None of us knows what day that will be.

M: We hear his call to watch.

C: We light one Advent candle as a sign of our watchfulness and waiting.

M: Come, Lord Jesus, be our guest.

C: Through your Word and Spirit may our souls be blessed.

One Advent candle is lit.

he will do what is just and right in the land.


¹⁶In those days Judah will be saved



Second Lesson

1 Thessalonians 3:9-13

Christ came the first time so that by his saving work we might be found blameless and holy when he comes again.

⁹How can we thank God enough for you in return for all the joy we have in the presence of our God because of you? ¹⁰Night and day we pray most earnestly that we may see you again and supply what is lacking in your faith.

¹¹Now may our God and Father himself and our Lord Jesus clear the way for us to come to you. ¹²May the Lord make your love increase and overflow for each other and for everyone else, just as ours does for you. ¹³May he strengthen your hearts so that you will be blameless and holy in the presence of our God and Father when our Lord Jesus comes with all his holy ones. Gospel Luke 19:28–40

Jesus rides into Jerusalem on a donkey colt, knowing he would soon be put to death. This is why Christ came.

28After Jesus had said this, he went on ahead, going up to Jerusalem. 29As he approached Bethphage and Bethany at the hill called the Mount of Olives, he sent two of

his disciples, saying to them, ³⁰"Go to the village ahead of you, and as you enter it, you will find a colt tied there, which no one has ever ridden. Untie it and bring it here. ³¹If anyone asks you, 'Why are you untying it?' say, 'The Lord needs it.'"

³²Those who were sent ahead went and found it just as he had told them. ³³As they were untying the colt, its owners asked them, "Why are you untying the colt?"

³⁴They replied, "The Lord needs it."

 35 They brought it to Jesus, threw their cloaks on the colt and put Jesus on it. 36 As he went along, people spread their cloaks on the road.

³⁷When he came near the place where the road goes down the Mount of Olives, the whole crowd of disciples began joyfully to praise God in loud voices for all the miracles they had seen:

³⁸"Blessed is the king who comes in the name of the Lord!"

"Peace in heaven and glory in the highest!"



Serve the Lord with gladness.


