WELS Christian Aid and Relief announced it has approved \$470,882 for humanitarian aid projects in WELS mission fields throughout the United States and worldwide for fiscal year 2021-22.

Projects are developed by WELS home and world missionaries, who continually look for opportunities to serve hurting people in their communities with ongoing basic needs, like food, clothing, shelter, and medical care. Rev. lief takes many forms, including providing smokeless stoves to safely heat homes in Asia, medical clinics, assistance for legal immigrants, vocational training, and backpacks and school supplies for underprivileged kids.

One of the most recent aid projects was supporting the digging of five boreholes in Zambia to provide clean and safe drinking water. "Here in the United States, we take fresh drinking water for granted, but in Africa access to fresh, clean water is often severely limited," says Sims. "These boreholes, which are often built near our churches, provide our missionaries a point of contact and an opportunity to talk to people about Jesus.
