

SEASON 2 EPISODE 1 - THUNDER

If you personally knew Jesus what would you remember the most about him? What words would have had the most impact on you? In the beginning of this episode the disciples share about how they met Jesus and John considers what he will write in his Gospel.

This episode explores the power of the Word, the power of Jesus' Word, and what it means that he is the Word. Hebrews 4:12 says "For the word of God is alive and active. Sharper than any double-edged sword, it penetrates even to dividing soul and spirit, joints and marrow; it judges the thoughts and attitudes of the heart." Though we didn't know Jesus personally we have the Bible and his Word. All of the questions asked above we can answer because we have his Word. His Word also tells us about ourselves and penetrates our souls. God has his ways, his love, and his words. Man has his ideas, his prejudices and his plans. The ways of God and the ways of men are contrasted in this episode. Seek and you will find. Seek his ways not man's ways.

Scripture Refrences:

John 1 (Intro to John's gospel that you see being written at the end of the episode); Luke 15: 1-7 (One of the tellings of the parable of The Lost Sheep); Matthew 4:18-22 (Jesus calls James and John); Luke 10: 25-37

Context - Most of the episode takes place in and around Sychar in Samaria. Jews and Samaritans have a history of hostility towards each other.
