## Synod Convention Opening Worship

guests filled the chapel at Luther Preparatory School, Watertown, Wis., Monday evening for the opening worship service of the 66<sup>th</sup> biennial convention.

WELS President Rev. Mark Schroeder presided over the service and Rev. Joel Voss, WELS second vice president and pastor at Resurrection, Centerville, Ohio, preached a sermon themed "By God's Grace. Here We Still Stand" based on Colossians 3:15-17. Rev. James Huebner. WELS first vice president and pastor at Grace, Milwaukee, Wis., was the cantor for the service.

Voss says, "Our Lord's encouragement in Colossians 3 is to let his Word dwell in us richly. That Word led Luther to take his stand at the Diet of Worms 500 years ago, and, by God's grace, that's where our beloved WELS still stands today. That's due to the grace of God. May we cherish it!"
