Free To Repent and Praise

Christ has set us free from the curse of the Law by becoming a curse for us (Galatians 3:13). During Lent we focus on all the things our sins did to Jesus. He took the cross. He did it because he loved us and wanted us to be a part of his eternal family. He wanted us to be set free.

Historically, Lent has also been

the serious nature of our sins and what they did to Jesus, the Church has worshipped differently during Lent. The phrase "Alleluia" is has often been omitted during the season. God has not commanded that it be set aside. but the Church has found a benefit in omitting it to reinforce a focus on repentance. Some of the songs of

praise in worship have been set aside for the same reason during the season of Lent. Again, God has not commanded it. but in freedom. many have found it beneficial.

Most of the 19 years I have been here we have sang "Farwell to Alleluia" as the closing hymn of Transfiguration worship. Transfiguration is the last Sunday before Ash Wednesday. This year we will not. Why? We will do it as an exercise of our Christian freedom.

A few years back some of our high school students who attended one of our areal Lutheran high schools attended another WELS

church in Lent where they were still using "Alleluia." This brought up questions in the mind of our members. They were concerned that this congregation was doing something wrong because curse of our sin and carried it to the they used "Alleluia" during Lent. We had taught why we said Farewell to Alleluia but we had not taught well enough that we did not have to say goodbye.

Since that time we have not said a season of repentance. To reinforce Farewell to Alleluia once or twice. We



do this so that we are reminded that it is okay to repent and say "Praise the Lord" (the meaning of Alleluia) at the same time. We are free in Christ to worship him in many different ways. However sometimes we can begin to think that something we have not seen in worship before must be wrong. That is why we took a great deal of time to teach the biblical symbolism of the imposition of ashes be-

fore we did it the first time. If we did not do this, we may trouble the conscience of those who might think we are doing something wrong. Now that we have seen it and been taught why it is biblically okay it should not trouble us. We may want to do it or not want to participate, that is okay. But now we know it is not "wrong."

The same is true with the phrase "Alleluia" in Lent. Some may prefer to omit it because of the emphasis on repentance. That is okay. But to use it and remember that we can praise the Lord because we are forgiven repentant sinners is okay also. We are free in Christ to worship in either way!

Leadership Team Notes

The Leadership Team met in person in January.

We ended 2020 with 721 members and 562 communicants. In 2002 we had 520members and 404 communicants. Average weekly worship attendance for the year was 193 in person. Bible class average attendance was 40.

The council granted Sue Pischke's request to transfer to St. Mark's, DePere. The council also received Abbey Marek as a communicant member by way of Adult Confirmation. Welcome plan to spend less time discuss-Abbev!

The council approved keeping member tuition for school at to us. We plan to spend more the current rate of \$1.200. We hope this will help families who are facing uncertainties connected to the pandemic. The council also set non-member tuition at the same amount. We do not want people to join our

church just to receive a break in tuition. With the advent of school choice funding we are able to share Jesus with nonmember students in way that does not impact our overall ministry. If we share Jesus with these students and their families who do not have a church home we hope they will consider joining us because of Jesus, not because of finances.

The Leadership Team spent time discussing how it will function moving forward. We ing day to day matters that others can handle and then report time planning ministry and overseeing our Gospel work. In the coming weeks we will share with the congregation how we are organized under our mission statement.

4K-5K

4K continues to learn the letters and sounds of the alphabet, along with numbers. They look forward to centers with 5K, working on iPad skills, and learning to take turns, follow directions, and listen other friends in their center group.

5K began reading sight words along with easy-reader books. They are excited to put their memorization and letter sounds knowledge to work with reading and decoding texts. They are working on skills like graphing for math and are finally enjoying what they've been looking forward to in science – studying penguins! They also had a second round of nationalized testing in math and reading, and in my opinion, the class has done well with their scores.

Love one another. What a wonderful message at Valentine's and all year through. We focused on Jesus' love for all through his parables and miracles. We looked at ways that we can show that same love to others. In math the first graders worked with time, skip counting and measurement. The second graders worked with money, temperature, and time. In phonics the second graders worked with contractions and suffixes. The first graders worked with long vowels. In grammar they worked with verbs and adjectives. We studied the states of matter and did some fun experiments including blowing up a balloon with baking soda and vinegar, microwaving ivory soap, and making dancin' raisins. We began a reading challenge for the third quarter. The kids are diving into books to move along a map in hopes of earning prizes along the way to reach the fishbowl and win a stuffed fish.
