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"When" Not "If"

On Sunday, Dec. 6 we had a Call Information Meeting in place of Bible Class. There were 64 people who attended. We discussed how a called worker evaluates a call. The called worker looks at the ministry needs at both places to which they are called and seeks to determine where their gifts would best serve God's kingdom.

about the ministry needs in South Dakota. I asked for input on my personal assessment of my gifts for ministry (I see my gifts as preaching, teaching, and leading a congregation to carry out its mission). I then asked some pointed questions about our ministry needs here.

The first was, "Do we need two pastors to carry out our ministry here at Morrison Zion?" From time to time I still hear rumblings that we do not need two pastors. The group that was there expressed overwhelming support for having two pastors in our ministry. They felt we were just beginning to implement new ministry plans but the pandemic derailed a number of those plans. They felt that to carry out the ministry we desire we will need two pastors whenever the pandemic ends.

The second question was, "Has my leadership voice become 'white noise' to many in the congregation?" This is a concern I have had for a number of years. Those who

were present felt that my vision for our ministry is still being heard by members.

I was encouraged by their responses, but I was also not surprised. The people who attended are those who have been present and involved with these types of decisions in the past. The people who do not get involved, but prefer to sit back and offer reaction to I presented what I have learned the decisions others make were not present. For many it is easier to react than to offer input on how to get more Jesus to more people.

> One comment that was made has stuck in my head from the moment it was made. Whether I continue my ministry here or a different lead pastor casts a vision, it is vital for our congregation to take this comment to heart. Understanding this comment and living it will drive the ministry of this congregation to the blessings God has in store for it. Ignoring the comment will doom it to limping along as the body of Christ.

A member said (I'm paraphrasing) that this congregation is very difficult to reach. We are resistant to change, perhaps a little hard headed. It takes repeated effort over and over to get us to be involved in sharing the gospel of Jesus with others. Next came what I wrote down, "When we break through that barrier we will need your leadership." Notice that they did not say "if" they said "when." This attitude is essential for us to be the members of Christ's body that he desires us to be!

Guidance

 The Fund may be used to help members or nonmembers who have any medical needs (including counseling).

• The Fund may receive gifts. The Fund shall continue until such a time that all of its funds have been distributed, or it is no longer deemed wise to have such a fund. Any remaining funds at the ending of this Fund shall be placed into the General Fund of the congregation

4K-5K

Although this past year was a year that no one predicted, it still was a gift from God. I am thankful for the opportunities that God has given both the church and school to give him glory, regardless if both places were closed for a while, church was online, and classes were taught virtually.

In December, 4K and 5K was a bit different. We normally take a good amount of time each day to practice Christmas Eve recitations and songs, but we were done with practices already by the first week in December! However, my students were just as excited to share the message of the Savior with all. This year we even had actions with one of our recitations! I cannot begin to tell you how much my students bring up not only the words and actions, but they also show application skills – understanding what they have learned, and not just repeating big words from the bible. I pray that we can do this more often so that they truly understand the message of Christmas in an age-appropriate way.

4K is continuing to focus most of their learning on letters names, sounds, and numbers. 5K is starting to get into sentence writing and reading, and they are officially reading books! It is always exciting to see them recognizing their sight words on random posters, books, and videos that we have around school.

For bible time, we just started delving into the New Testament. In the afternoons for devotion, we have enjoyed the children's advent devotions. On one day, the devotion was the exact same bible story we had earlier that day! My students love the picture ornaments that go along with the story, and the fact that every devotion speaks about our Savior, baby Jesus!
