Don't Go On The Gong Show

The Gong Show was an amateur talent show created by Chuck Barris. It aired from 1976-1978 and was redone in 2017. I remember watching the show from time to time in the summer when I was young. The acts were often horrible. When they were bad the celebrity judges had the option of bringing them to an early end by loudly banging on a huge gong. Some people sought out the gong by being terrible and others thought they were great, but were truly gong worthy.

In 1 Corinthians 13, God urges us to not appear on the Going Show. He is not talking about the TV show Chuck Barris created. He is talking about the show our sinful nature wants us to star in guite often.

In 1 Corinthians 12:31-13:3 the Holy Spirit had Paul write for the Corinthians and us:

> Now eagerly desire the greater gifts.

And yet I will show you the most excellent way.

If I speak in the tongues of men or of angels, but do not have love. I am only a resounding gong or a clanging cymbal. If I have the gift of prophecy and can fathom all mysteries a faith that can move mounnothing. If I give all I possess to the poor and give over my body to hardship that I may boast, but do not have love, I gain nothing.

Our sinful nature has a burning desire to let others know how gifted, smart and right we are compared to them. If we give into the sinful nature's wishes to speak and act without love we are on the Gong Show. This is a show that God would love to see cancelled in our lives!

It is possible to be right and still be wrong. What in the world does that mean? God wants us to be right. doesn't he. After all, His Word is truth so we have to speak the truth, don't we? Certainly! But God also tells us to speak the truth in love.

If we speak the truth out of anything but Christ-like love we are sinning. If I speak the truth in a condescending, unloving way, I sin. If I speak the truth in a way that only wants to let you know how wrong you are and how right I am. I sin. If I speak the truth about someone or their behavior out of the desire to "put them in their place" and belittle them, I sin.

So how in the world do we avoid this "Gong Show"?

I need to grow in my love for Jesus so that I love like he does in all my thoughts, words, and actions. I will fail. But in Christ I am forgiven. That forgiveness moves me to want to get better at speaking and acting in Christian love.

Jesus loved me (and vou) when we and all knowledge, and if I have were wrong. He loved us when our actions were abhorrent to him. He loved tains, but do not have love, I am us to the point of dving on the cross. That is why we will want to get better at living in "the most excellent way." That way is loving others the way Jesus loved us!
