Get these out of here! Stop turning my Father's house into a market!" 17 His disciples remembered that it is written: people. He tells us our bodies are "Zeal for your house will con**sume me.".** (John 2:16-17 NIV)

The Gospel for the 3rd Sunday in Lent brings us the account of Jesus driving people and animals out of the temple. The temple was only place or the only time we en-

the place where God told his people he would cause his name to dwell. His glory appeared and filled Solomon's temple when it was dedicated. The mercy seat on the Ark of the Covenant was spoken of as the throne of God. The Temple in Jerusalem was the house of God.

This fact is what caused Je-

sus to be consumed by zeal and drive the money changers and those selling animals for sacrifices out of the temple's courtyard. To those selling doves he said, "Stop turning my Father's house into a market!" Zeal for his Father and his Father's house was obvious to see in Jesus.

Where is God's house today? I have often heard people apply this passage to our church build-

ings today. But I am not so sure that is what God considers his "house" today. God tells us that he lives in his "temples of the Holy Spirit, who is in you." God lives in his people through Word and sacrament. True, we encounter Word and sacrament in our church buildings, but that is not the

> counter them. Today, believers are God's house!


Knowing this truth, the next important question is to ask yourself, "Since I am God's house. what would Jesus want to grab a whip and drive out of me?" Each of us needs to use the Ten Commandments of God from the First Lesson for the 3rd Sunday in Lent (Exodus 20) to see what sins God would like to

drive out of us. You are no different than the money changers in John 2. You have turned God's house into things worse than a market.

Live the focus on Lent! Turn away from your sin! Repent! Throw your sins on Jesus! Rejoice in your forgiveness! Then turn back to Exodus 20 and see how you can use the 10 commandments to thank God for making you a part of his house!

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Power of Attorney Presentation on March 22

Power of Attorney Papers for health care and finance are very important papers everyone over the age of 18 should have but typically are only thought of when one is older and your health is starting to fail. These forms allow you to determine who you want to make decisions for you if something would happen where you cannot make them for yourself due to situations such as a car accident, stroke, traumatic brain injury or the like. If completed they help you to avoid the extra cost of having to file guardianship papers that most people pay an attorney to do and that require court hearings, cost for filing fees and guardian ad litem fees, and court oversight including annual paperwork and fees required by the courts. If you are interested in filling out papers for yourself or learning more about them so you can help a family member who may benefit from having them please join us on March 22 at 7:00 p.m. Dawn Tisler is a member of our church and as part of her job as an Adult Protective Services Social Worker she has helped many people fill them out and will provide you the forms and an explanation of how to fill them out. If anyone wants additional help filling them out she would also be willing to provide this. If anyone in our congregation happens to be a notary, could you please contact Dawn Tisler at 323-0529 because the Power of Attorney for finance papers need to be signed in front of a notary and if we could have one there just in case someone wants to fill them out it would be helpful.
