Dead Means Dead

So, my brothers, you also died to the law through the body of Christ, that you might belong to another, to him who was raised from the dead, in order that we might bear fruit to God. For when we were controlled by the sinful nature, the sinful passions aroused by the law were at work in our bodies, so that we bore fruit for death. But now, by dying to what once bound us, we have been released from the law so that we serve in the new way of the Spirit, and not in the old way of the written code. Romans 7:4-6

Have you ever thought about what it means that we, who are Christians, are "dead" to the law as Paul says above? What does death do to our earthly relationships?

If a person who is serving a 30 year prison term dies in the middle of year 12, does the warden make sure his body remains in prison another 18 years? Of course not! His sentence ended when he died. It ended his earthly relationship to his sentence. If a hearse is pulled over for speeding on the way to the cemetery, does the policeman give the ticket to the corpse in the casket? Of course not! He is no longer under the control of the law!

What about us? As Christians, are we still liable to keep the law of God? Reread what the Holy Spirit had Paul write in Romans 7 up above before you are too quick to answer. God's answer for us is "No." We are not accountable for keeping the law because we died to the law in Jesus. He kept it in our place. We no longer have to keep it to be right with God. Now we live

in a new relationship to the law. "We have been released from the law so that we serve in the new way of the Spirit, and not in the old way of the written code." The old way of keeping the law is do to it out of fear of punishment. Christ was punished in our place. We no longer live in that fear. We have been released. Now we serve in the way of the Spirit. We serve God because we want to thank him. We love him because he first loved us. We live in the "Get to" of the Christian faith, not the "Have to" of the law.

The written code operates by threatening the sinful nature. You know how your sinful nature reacts to commands. Think about it. What was the first thing you wanted to do the last time you saw a "Wet Paint: Don't Touch!" sign? You know you wanted to touch it. Your sinful nature does not want to be told what to do.

That is what Paul is talking about when he says "when we were controlled by the sinful nature, the sinful passions aroused by the law were at work in our bodies." When we try to live under the written code our sinful nature gets riled up and moves us to rebel. When we live by the Spirit we do not focus on the commands of the law. Instead, we focus on the law as a guide that shows us ways that we can show our love for God.

Stop feeding your sinful nature the steroids of thinking that you have to obey the law in order for God to love you. Live in response to God's love for you in Christ. Then the gospel will move you to do more for God in your life than you would ever begin to dream is possible!
