MJMPMO

2 And so it was with me, brothers and sisters. When I came to you, I did not come with eloquence or human wisdom as I proclaimed to you the testimony about God. ² For I resolved to know nothing while I was with you except Jesus Christ and him crucified. ³ I came to you in weakness with great fear and trembling. ⁴ My message and my preaching were not with wise and persuasive words, but with a demonstration of the Spirit's power, ⁵ so that your faith might not rest on human wisdom, but on God's power. 1 Corinthians 2:1-5

Paul makes the case to the Christians in Corinth pretty clearly. He was all about Jesus. It wasn't about how smart he was. It wasn't about how they felt about him. It was all about sharing Jesus with them while he was there. He wanted them to know Jesus so that they could be connected to him by faith. Faith in Jesus would be the most important thing they could have. Faith that Jesus lived and died to take away the guilt of their sin would give them eternity. Nothing was more vital!

Nothing is more vital for us today. Paul's words are just as important to us today. It defines why we exist as a congregation. We are here to proclaim Christ crucified for the sins of the world. That means we share with people the good news that Jesus died for their sins. Nothing we do as a congregation is more important!

In our Leadership Team meetings, I have taken to saving that

When I want to say it quickly it is shortened to "MJMPMO" More Jesus, More People More Often." Nothing is more important.

The times we worship are not as important as proclaiming Jesus at worship. Your preferences about how things are done are not as important as MJMPMO. Meeting your families desires or wishes are not as important as MJMPO. Sitting in your favorite pew is not as important as MJMPO.

Every decision we make should be about MJMPO. I do not think it always is. We get side tracked by many things that are, at best, only very distantly related to proclaiming Jesus. We are at a point in time in our congregation when we need to recommit to MJMPO. In some areas we have made a good start. Our food pantry works hard to share the message of Jesus as it shows the love of Jesus. Our Barnabas ministers are reaching out to the those who seem to have drifted away from Word and sacrament. Many of our members live MJMPO as you can see by the seeds that are on the murals in the back of church.

What about you? Will you make it your personal mission to keep Christ crucified the center of your life?

MJMPO is not easy to pronounce. It is harder to live. We will fail our God. But thanks be to him that he will never fail us! We are his forgiven children through Jesus. As such, we will work to get MJMPMO!

Barnabas Ministry Begins Visits Again

In September the Barnabas Ministry met with those willing to begin personal visits again to encourage their brothers and sister in Christ to stay close to Jesus. Over 20 people were in attendance. Nearly 30 have agreed to serve. In the past few years, this has been the most encouraging thing I have seen in our ministry!

As of this writing we have over 740 members. We are averaging about 225 in worship and about 40 online each week. Those numbers are frightening to me. I am concerned some of our members will not be in heaven with me. Faith that is not fed by Word and sacrament is faith that is in danger. The enemies of our relationship with God do not take days off. They are always working to separate us from Jesus. Jesus has told us he will strengthen us in our faith through Word and sacrament.

The Barnabas ministry exists to encourage people to stay close to Jesus by making use of Word and sacrament. We seek to encourage, not shame or guilt people into being close to Jesus.

This is a pivotal time for our congregation. Please join me in praying that the Spirit opens the hearts of the people who our Barnabas ministry visits that they see the love their brothers and sisters have for them. Even more importantly, pray that God opens their eyes to see the love he has for them. Paul sums up my thoughts about our Barnabas ministers well in 2 Thessalonians 1:3: We ought always to thank God for you, brothers and sisters, and rightly so, because your faith is growing more and more, and the love all of you have for one another is increasing.
