ter. We include the percentage of our membership so that we know what these numbers mean. They are down significantly from years past. Our top priority in ministry now is enabling people to worship more frequently.

With all that being said, there is a very important question that needs to be addressed: What is your role in accomplishing this vital task?

Pray that more and more of our members worship in person or online. Also, please focus on another very important thing you can do. It is something almost all of you like to do, in fact, you do it every day. What is it?

Talk to your friends and relatives pital. It is where broken people who who are members. Talk to them about worship and discuss why it is important in the life of a Christian. The simple truth is that hearing it from you is gong to stick with people more than reading it in a newsletter.

I hear very often (even from people that provide articles for the newsletter) that they don't read it. I hear from people that they don't read the announcement sheet or the screens before church. I hear from people that they do not use social media or go to the website. We use all these means to communicate because the gospel of Jesus is the most important message we can share. But we understand everyone does not use each one. But they will listen to you!

Leadership Team Notes

The Leadership Team (LT) reviewed progress on the work that is ongoing in the three areas of focus for this year. The new Parenting email has had its first issue go out. All other work is on track.

The LT discussed staffing the Care Committee for Called Workers. All the members of the committee are stepping aside at the end of the calendar year. We approved some names of those who will care for the spiritual well being of called workers. Next month we will bring names of those who can plan celebrations, arrivals, and other events for called workers. We also approved Lucas Soderlund as the head Thursday night usher. The congregation will cover conference, hotel, and flight expenses for the Enderles. The General Fund will cover any expenses that the door offering does not.

Asbestos Letter

January 14, 2022

Dear Called Workers, Employees, Students, Parents, and Morrison Zion Lutheran Church Members Subject: Asbestos Abatement and Inspection

This letter is being sent to you as part of our requirement for our asbestos program. The program requires inspection to take place every 6 months and an annual letter be sent to the above personnel.

The following information regarding asbestos has been submitted for your review in the past and is once again being forwarded to you. Asbestos is a natural occurring mineral that was and is still used as an insulating and reinforcement material. Various diseases have been linked with the industrial exposure to airborne asbestos. The extensive use of asbestos products in buildings has raised concerns about exposure to asbestos in non-industrial settings. The presence of asbestos in a building does not mean that the health of the occupants are endangered. As long as the asbestos containing the material remains in good condition, and is not disturbed, exposure is unlikely.

Areas in our school which may contain asbestos include: Terrazzo flooring, the floor tile in the classrooms and basement, possibly the sheet vinyl flooring in the kitchen, the ceramic tile and grout by the toilets, and the fire door in the furnace room. If you should notice any degradation of any of these materials, contact a school official.

The school was last inspected on December of 2021 for this purpose and no changes or deterioration of condition were observed in the areas that contain asbestos. This report is on file in the church's secretary office under the title of "Periodic Surveillance Report" in the asbestos manual.

We had an inspection from the American Air Environmental Services on March 8, 2019. This inspection is done every three years.
