

EPISODE 5 - THE WEDDING GIFT

Introduction - Blind Eyes - Many things vie for our attention. We have set goals and five-year plans, opinions and political affiliations, needs and responsibilities, relationships and reputations to maintain, and specific ways we want our lives to unfold. But what we prioritize and pursue tends to also be where we place our hope—hope for happiness, steadiness, wholeness, and the like.

Turns out, there's nothing new under the sun because the people in Jesus's day also had a tendency to misplace hope. In episode 5 of The Chosen called "The Wedding Gift," the parents are hoping for a union that will benefit their children and a celebration that will secure their standing in the community. The newlyweds are hoping for a happy, healthy life together full of love and children and fulfilled dreams. The disciples are hoping that Jesus would interrupt the festivities to make His Messianic debut and accelerate their emancipation from Rome. And wedding attendees are hoping for a really good party.
