> Pray that more and more of our families put Jesus first in their lives. Pray that parents become more of a little Christ as they parent their children. Pray that they live and speak their faith regularly. Also, please focus on another very important thing you can do. It is something almost all of you like to do, in fact, you do it every day. What is it?

Barnabas Ministry

All five handouts about our revised ministry are still available by the steps to the balcony at church. Here is what this ministry will look like: Contacts with members who have not been in worship will be made at the following intervals:

4 weeks absent: The Barnabas Minister assigned to the absent member makes contact by phone to see if everything is okay with the member. If there is anything we can do as a congregation to help with illness, etc. the minister will inform the Elder and Pastor assigned to this member.

8 weeks absent: The Pastor assigned will phone to encourage the member and see if there is anything they might need to meet to discuss.

12 weeks absent: The Elder assigned will send a letter and follow up with a phone call.16 weeks absent: The Barnabas Minister makes contact by phone or in person to offer encouragement to walk close with Jesus.

24 weeks absent: The Pastor sends a letter asking to meet in the next week.

30 weeks absent: The Elder tries to visit in person.

36 weeks absent: The Pastor and Elder send a jointly signed letter that notes the seriousness of the situation. It will inform the member that if the absent member does not return, he or she will come under church discipline. It invites the member to contact the Elder or Pastor.

44 weeks absent: The Pastor and Elder attempt to schedule a face to face visit. If that is refused, the conversation may occur by phone, if that is refused, the process goes to step nine.

52 weeks absent: A letter is sent by the Pastor informing him or her that he or she is being removed from membership because they have self-excluded themselves from the congregation.

Training will be on Thursday, April 6 at 6:00 p.m. and repeated Saturday, April 9 at 9:00 a.m. Learn more at the Open Forum in church on April 3 after late worship.
