1 Corinthians 15:20

In 1 Corinthians 15 the Holy Spirit led Paul to lay out before us a series of "if...then" statements based on Jesus' resurrection. If Christ has not been raised from the dead then various things about Paul, his ministry, and the life of the Corinthians (and us) are true. However, if Christ has indeed been raised, then this truth changes us and our purpose for living. This month we look at these implications.

"If Christ has not raised... We are then found to be false witnesses about God." (1 Co 15:14,15). Wor If Jesus is still in the grave the apostles are the biggest scam artists in the history of the world. They are nothing more than liars, deceivers, frauds, charlatans. If Jesus did not rise, think of what this says

Whatever they wrote could not possibly be trusted. Their entire testimony centered in the resurrection.

about the apostles.

When they say to us that we are forgiven through by being baptized into Christ's

death and resurrection, they are lying. Baptism would be useless.

When they tell us our sins are forgiven in Holy Communion they would be liars. If Christ could not leave the grave how could he have the power to have his body and blood in, with, and under the bread and wine? The Lord's Supper would be useless to us.

If Christ did not rise, studying the Bible would be as productive as watching grass grow. The apostles' words would not be worthy of study. The prophets who foresaw the Savior's death and resurrection would be useless to us also. The time spent in Bible Study would be better off spent watching an infomercial about the latest and greatest wallpaper remover.

Jesus himself would be a liar because he sent his apostles out as witnesses of the resurrection.

"But Christ has indeed been raised from the dead" (1 Co 15:20). Christ has risen! He has risen indeed! Therefore the apostles' teaching is trustworthy, certain and worthy of our time

and study! It is the most important thing in the world because it shows how Jesus has opened the gates

to heaven for us!

The sacraments offer us the certain forgiveness of sins.
They bring us the one who "was put to death for our sins and raised to life for our justification." We rejoice in the power and comfort that Baptism and Communion brings to us!

The inspired words of the Apostles and Prophets are certain and true. The comfort they offer us in times of difficulty is genuine and

trustworthy. The God who gave his life for us will be with us and bless us. He will strengthen us through his inerrant word. Therefore, the time spent in God's Word alone and with others has a guaranteed value. The study of scripture becomes of the highest priority in our lives because it is God himself speaking to us exactly the things he wants us to know! Sure beats TV!

The resurrection is certain. Live in the comfort of the resurrection.
