Why Worship? We Come to Listen

Some studies have suggested that the average American hears or sees over 3,000 ads every day. These ads cover everything from soup to nuts. They are often loud, sometimes funny, and often just plain mind-numbing.

In all those messages that you are bombarded with day after day after day, there is one topic that rarely

comes up—Jesus. The news doesn't talk about him or his church, unless there is a scandal somewhere.

When you do find messages that the world proclaims about Jesus they have little to do with what he says about himself. The History Channel is of no use if you want to meet Jesus as he reveals himself in the Bible. Their scholars tell you how the Bible is a book of men, not of God.

This truth highlights one reason why we gather together to worship our Lord. We come to listen. As his sheep, we long to hear the voice of our Good Shepherd. You won't find it on The View. You won't hear it on "Green Bay's Oldies Station." You will hear it as you sit quietly and listen at worship. At worship we leave behind the blaring political commercials. We step away from the din of our busy schedules and we sit quietly and wait. We wait for someone to read the Scripture to us and then comment on it.

Sure, we can do this on our own. God's will certainly is that we find

time daily to do that. But when we don't make time to gather with others we often begin to forget the message of God's love for us in Christ. There are so many competing demands on our time and attention we easily get distracted. We begin to forget. We drift away.

When we don't make time to listen at worship we can easily begin to imagine

what God says instead of listen to him. We want him to say our sin is not really a sin. We want him to say it is the other guy's fault, not ours. If we don't listen closely to his voice, we begin to believe our imagination. We drift away from the Spirit and into ourselves.

When we come to listen to God regularly at worship, however, we allow the voice of the Good Shepherd to guide us as his sheep. We listen to his correction. We hear the message of his forgiveness. We go out to face the week with a

deepened love and trust in our Good Shepherd. We bend our thinking to his. That shapes and forms us so we can recognize the lies of the devil and the world around us. We get better at picking out the voice of the Good Shepherd. We then reject the voice of any false shepherd. Worship keeps us connected to the Good Shepherd. In that connection is eternal life!
