"You are a chosen people, a royal priesthood, a holy nation, a people belonging to God, that you may declare the praises of him who called you out of darkness into his wonderful light."

REDEEMED - We have been redeemed through the blood of Jesus. God's righteous justice has been satisfied by Jesus' death. John 3:16 "For God so loved the world that he gave his one and only Son, that whoever believes in him shall not perish but have eternal life."

RENEWED - Such God-given faith in Jesus changes our whole life. We see life God's way and in thankfulness want to live for Him. We are renewed by the Holy Spirit. There is new joy amid the old, depressing problems. There is new strength to cope with old headaches and temptations. The fruit of the Spirit are many and varied. Some are listed in Galatians 5:22.23

But what do I say when they say ...

"I've always found churches so cold. I get the impression that no one cares whether I'm there or not."

Remember this verse . . .

Luke 15:10 "There is rejoicing in the presence of the angels of God over one sinner who repents."

"God has a personal interest in your soul. The angels of heaven rejoice when you trust Jesus as your Savior. Our congregation is also vitally interested in your spiritual welfare, but unfortunately, at times we don't express this love as perfectly as we should. We ask you to forgive these human failings and take the fact that we are here inviting you as proof that this congregation is interested in you."

Leadership Team Notes

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Update from Grenada

Dear Members of Morrison Zion

On May 14, I received a call to serve at Grace Lutheran in Grenada. As a daughter of MZLC, I was asked to give a few updates on my new ministry. I am honored and excited to share some of my experiences.

I arrived in Grenada with my mom and friend, Colleen Tasch. I was encouraged to have family accompany me on my trip so that they would have an idea of what my life would be like. I am thankful they were able to join me and to enjoy a Caribbean vacation complete with swimming under waterfalls, visiting a deserted island, and drinking fresh coconut water.

The first few days were a vacation, but now that my family has returned to the States, reality has begun to set in. School just finished on the island, so my current responsibilities are acclimating to the temperature and culture and planning for the upcoming school year. There is a lot to get used to in every aspect of life from what foods are available at the grocery store to a different currency. In addition, the bus system is foreign to me but is a better alternative to learning to drive on roads that are more reminiscent of an amusement park ride than I-41.

For many people, an abrupt change in lifestyle and surrounding culture can be frightening. I would be lying if I said that I haven't been nervous or unsure about where I was or what I was supposed to be doing. I have so many questions that have yet to be answered concerning the school, the city, the people, the customs, etc. But, rather than be scared to leave my apartment, I get to switch my thinking to a growth mindset.

I am recognizing the joys of immersing myself in a brand new culture. I am meeting new people and learning how to relate to them. I am helping share the Gospel in another corner of the earth. It might seem terrifying as of now when everything is new, but I have confidence that this will be one of the biggest blessings in my life. I pray that God will use me to be an even bigger blessing to the children and people of Grenada. Rachel Ihlenfeldt
