Worship as the body of Christ

In an on-demand world, our spiritual lives can conform or stand out. A Christian community can be known as the body of Christ. As "God's elect, exiles" (1 Peter 1:1), God's people have an opportunity to be known as a distinctively Christian

community. As "a chosen people . . . called . . . out of darkness into his wonderful light," Christian communities can reflect the unique character they have in the world.

As a Christian submitting yourself to Bible teachings that sometimes make you uncomfortable and upset your personal preferences, you can reflect that same humility in your church community. Your church practices conform to the truths of who God is and your relationship to him. Media and marketing trends take a back seat to transcendent truths you need to hear. Your habits in church can stand out in the world in a refreshingly positive way.

When worship begins, your selfchosen identity is overcome by your baptismal incorporation into the body of Christ. Confessing your sin and your sinfulness takes you out of your impulses of looking to have your personal needs met. Finding forgiveness in Jesus brings you what you most desperately need. The Word of God proclaimed in law and gospel speaks authoritatively over your opinions and feelings. Singing together with fellow Christians allows you to communicate to one another the truths of God's Word. Praying with and for Christians around the world unites you in heart and mind, reminding you of your dependence on God. When you observe a baptism and participate in the Lord's Supper, you get to see God's power in action beyond what is merely visible. Worship practices shape us. Habits break down tendencies to adopt cultural assumptions.

In a world where you can sit back and soak up a customized array of personal options, your faith community can stand apart. *Your participation in worship can redirect you to your identity in Christ.* Your church gathered together can be known as a distinctive Christian community.

Food Pantry

We served 38 families on Sept. 2. We had 6 new families come for assistance. It once again was a very successful giveaway. Each family received a gallon of milk, eggs, sweet corn, green peppers, zucchini, tomatoes, potatoes, fresh cilantro and a package of chicken, along with the regular canned goods and personal hygiene items. Thank you to all the families who contributed fresh items from their gardens. The pantry is currently looking into joining Feeding America. Feeding America supplies food to Food pantries and other non-profit organizations across America. They get large donations from numerous companies to distribute. They do not charge for a lot of food items, but there are charges for some items. They charge for these items by the pound, which decreases the cost for them. We are looking into this, as we are going through a lot of food each month and are helping a lot more families than we used to. In order to join, the pantry has to be open at least 2 days a month for a total of 4 hours. We meet 2 of those hours currently on Saturdays. We are considering extending Saturdays hours to 2 ½ hours. We would then be open 1 ½ hours on a Tuesday, Wednesday, or Thursday evening. We have one person who has volunteered to help with the evening shift, we need at least two more. The evening we will be open will be determined by what would work the best for the volunteers serving. Time open has not been determined as of yet. If you are interested in volunteering, please speak with Pastor Enderle or Pam Mueller. Again, this is just something we're checking into to see if it would be beneficial to our pantry. There are a lot of guidelines we would also have to meet. If you need assistance, please call to make an appointment, (920) 246-5435. Please keep the pantry in your prayers. Thank-you!

This month we are going to learn about Joseph and Moses in Bible class. 5K will finish reviewing the letters of the alphabet and begin to learn how to put the letters together to sound out CVC words. 4K will begin learning their letters with A, B, C, and D this month. In math 5K will learn how to compare numbers 0 to 5 and 4K will be practicing their sorting skills. In social studies we will be finishing up our unit on citizenship and in science we will continue to study trees and weather by identifying and observing weather each day. Grades 1-2

Bubbles and kites! No, not recess toys, but science tools to learn about air and weather. We enjoyed many investigations with air during our science unit. We also will be visiting FOX 11 on Tuesday, October 10th to see the weather center and learn more about predicting the weather from Pete Petoniak. Meanwhile we're studying addition, loving our secret stories, and working on our letters and sounds. We learned about primary and secondary colors by painting rainbow dogs, then studied our first illustrator, David Shannon, and made No David pictures. We're starting our first reading challenge with a bug theme. The students will earn bug prizes for the books they read and report. How many bugs will they fit in their jars? Grades 3-4

The 3rd and 4th graders are doing well with getting into their new routine. We are learning about the lives of Jacob and Joseph in Christ Light. Our reading unit has been focusing on reading different styles of writing and how different styles are better for different purposes. Our social studies unit begins with looking at the geography of the United States.

We're already a couple of weeks into the new school year, and things are going great! In Christ Light we are now focusing our study on the prophet Isaiah and the message God is sharing through him. The seventh and eighth graders will continue learning about integers and rational numbers in math. In American History our focus is currently on reconstruction after the Civil War. Students will work on identifying different types of conflict within a plot as we explore various texts. Our class enjoyed a field trip to Pinecrest Historical Village at the end of September.
