# Thankful Service to the Lord

God encourages us to give thanks to the Lord in all situations. We especially are reminded to do so as we approach Thanksgiving. As we reflect on the Morrison Zion theme for 2023-2024 Rejoice in the Lord, always (Philippians 4:4) we know we have more blessings from God than one could count at a Thanksgiving meal.

In 1 Corinthians 12 Paul reminds us that we can be thankful for the many people in our lives. <sup>27</sup>Now you are the body of Christ, and each one of you is a part of it. God has brought each and everyone of us together here at Morrison for his purposes. Jesus leads the church but he gives out wonderful gifts to his people. <sup>5</sup> *There are* different kinds of service, but the same Lord. There is one Lord and Savior. His love and forgiveness creates a new spirit in us who seek not to serve ourselves but to serve God and others. This is love: not that we loved God, but that he loved us and sent his Son as an atoning sacrifice for our sins. Dear friends, since God so loved us, we also ought to love one another (1 John 4:10-11).

One of the 3 main emphasis of 2023 for Morrison Zion is Service out of Love for Christ. A devotional booklet encouraging gospel motivated service was mailed to over 400 households. These devotions focused on how it is important to serve in joy, not out of compulsion. They also emphasized that you can give glory to God by serving at home, at work, and in all your varied vocations. It is often important to prioritize your other vocations before serving at church or school.

Included in these devotional booklets was a survey listing many service opportunities. Members were asked to return these paper surveys or return a digital version. These devotions were also sent out in our weekly emails and in the school newsletter. After each devotion there was a link to fill out the survey.

Rejoice in the Lord! Because of these surveys several members shared that they

were interested in visiting and encouraging members. These members met with Pastor Enderle and formed a new visitation team. We now have 4 members assisting in visiting shut-ins. This is a tremendous blessing. It has allowed members of Morrison Zion to use their gifts and be involved in ministry in a new way.

While there is much to rejoice in, there is still progress to be made. Some say in teamwork that 80% of the work is done by 20% of the people. It may feel like the same people are asked to do most of the work or the same people volunteer to do most of the work. This leads to burnout and frustration. People may then serve out of compulsion instead of joy and thanks. Others feel left out and wonder why they are never asked to help. If one part suffers, every part suffers with it; (1 Corinth 12:26). These surveys are designed to include new people in ways they desire to serve the Lord.

Morrison Zion is made up of over 700 souls and over 550 adult members. Of the 400 surveys that were sent out 13 have been returned. It has been difficult to involve new people from the surveys since so few have been turned in. When surveys are turned names can be given to people leading the different service opportunities.

If you haven't yet shared your gifts and interests take a few minutes to do so on paper or online. Devotional booklets with the surveys will be available at church.

In October, Tara Forst and son were granted a peaceful release.

The LT discussed and approved new policy for leave for teachers for the birth of a child and a new policy for paid time off.
