Our church and our synod have been blessed with a unique unity and fellowship. We are all part of the body of Christ, and we can serve him together in different ways each using the many gifts given by God (1 Corinthians 12 and Romans 12). We have always done this a synod, area churches, and within the local church. Zion has been blessed with opportunities to partner with area ministries to better accomplish our goals. Consider how we support local high schools like Manitowoc Lutheran and Fox Valley. For around a decade, Morrison Zion and Immanuel Shirley have partnered to supporting a Lutheran Elementary School.

Over the last few years, Zion and Immanuel have begun to partner in more ministry opportunities. One of the best examples of this is our Youth Group program. Churches of all sizes struggle to have functioning youth groups, often due to lack of volunteers. Organizing and running a youth group, hosting events, making meals, having devotions, and much more can be done well by one person who has the time to make it a major focus of their time (often as a volunteer). With called worker shortages, these jobs are often asked of called workers who don't have the time to give a healthy focus to the program and the kids.

With Zion and Immanuel, a team was formed of pastors and lay people working together, using their talents, gifts and ideas. It also makes sense to work together since many of the students in the youth group age from both congregations know each other well from elementary school. Some events and Bible Studies are done together, while others are still done separately. By working together for the Youth Group, what one church couldn't do at all or at least well on their own, is done with ease and with excellence. We are able to be a blessing to the area, invite kids who have no youth group at their churches to join us for activities, like our corn maze trip. More people with new ideas and gifts are able to be involved from more churches. The goal is not 1+1=2 but 1+1=3. Working together produces more

Zion and Shirley have had a history of working together with the Lutheran Elementary School, with youth group, online Bible Studies, Advent by Candlelight and more. We are starting a joint Bible Reading Plan and beginning a monthly pulpit rotation.

What more could we do in the future if we work together, using the gifts God has blessed us with? For around a decade, both Immanuel and Zion have discussed ideas of having an Early Childhood ministry. Individually, both churches have interest and see the blessings, but apart these ideas have stalled. Would merging to be one church with two locations benefit our reach with the Gospel, to get more Jesus, to more people, in more locations?

God is blessing our current partnerships. We will seek God's guidance as we plan, pray, and discuss how God has gifted Zion and Immanuel, and what he has for us in the future. We plan to discuss these ideas and opportunities more and more. Join us for two open forums in January, on Sunday, Jan. 14 and Sunday, Jan. 28 from 9:15 -10:15 am. Worship In January

Notes on Worship

In January the church year moves from Christmas to Epiphany. Epiphany comes from a Greek word meaning "reveal." Epiphany is sometimes known as "The Gentiles' Christmas." We Gentiles (non-Jews) rejoice in the good news that this Jewish baby is not just the Savior of Jews. He is for all people—The Savior of the world. The days between Christmas and Epiphany are the original 12 Days of Christmas. Epiphany falls on January 6.

We will not have a special separate Epiphany service but will celebrate Epiphany on January 4 and 7. This will shift the traditional weeks of Epiphany slightly as we will still celebrate Epiphany 1—The Baptism of the Lord the following week. Epiphany takes us from the Jordan River and the baptism of Jesus to the Mount of Transfiguration leading up to the season of Lent as Jesus heads to the cross.
