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Merge for Mission: Feedback—Phase 1 & 2

“Go into all the world and preach the gospel to all creation. Whoever believes and is baptized will be saved...” (Mark 16:15-16)

What a blessed mission we have. Jesus gives us peace through forgiveness today and for eternity! And we get to tell others!

Nearly 100 people met at the Ponderosa in Morrison on March 9 to consider how we as Christians in this area can best carry out that mission. Pastor Joel Gaertner from WELS Congregational Services presented *Merge for Mission: Phase 1—Exploration* walking us through history, the current situations, and possibilities for the future.

In the presentation we learned many statistics about history and today. One example of this is that in 1980, 1 in 3 unchurched Americans were actively looking to join a church. Today it is 1 in 30. All Christian denominations are shrinking and the number of people who claim “no religion” is skyrocketing. What can be done?

Along with a changing religious landscape we have many changes in culture from when churches were first started here. 150 years ago, in our area, many churches were needed in a small area because transportation was much more difficult. Now we travel 20 minutes to buy groceries. It is said that the average Christian is happy to drive around 15 minutes to church. How many separate churches do we have in a 15-mile radius?

In the WELS we currently have a called worker shortage. Since 1990

WELS membership decreased about 90,000. Yet, we actually have nearly the same amount of pastors as we did in 1990. There is currently about 1 pastor for every 92 weekly worshipers. Here at Zion we worship over 250 weekly worshipers, well over the average number of people an average pastor serves. This is not including serving a school. How can we at Morrison and as Christians in our areas best carry out the mission of nurturing believers and sharing the gospel with others? Could we consider new ways to work together for the good of the kingdom?

The presenter encouraged us to consider always come back to these thoughts when considering new ways to carry out our mission:

Nevers Ask:

- ◆ “How is this change going to affect me?”
- ◆ “Do I like this proposed change?”

Continually ask:

- ◆ “Is this change an attempt to better carry out the mission Christ has given us?”
- ◆ “Is this proposal well thought out?”
- ◆ “If so, how can I help make it happen?”

So we ask, could we do more by working together with Immanuel Shirley? We have many members who are gifted by God. What if we can combine our gifts, talents, and resources and use them together instead of working separately and what sometimes feels like a competition? *(continues from page 3)*

Notes on Worship

St. Paul writes, “Christ has indeed been raised from the dead” (1 Corinthians 15:20). Big word: Indeed! Paul is stressing that we must not think of Jesus’ resurrection like a happy ending to another epic fable. The resurrection is not legend. It really happened. Easter is not just a holiday. Easter is history. On time’s infinite line, Jesus’ resurrection is the punctiliar moment that defines reality for us all. If Christ remained dead, he is a fraud and failure. But Christ has indeed been raised. So, the reality: Jesus is exactly what he claimed to be—the Son of God, our Lord and Savior. If Christ remained dead, then the grave is the final, ugly, rotten end of us all. But Christ has indeed been raised. So, the reality is Jesus’ resurrection proves that “all will be made alive” (1 Corinthians 15:22). The reality of the resurrection does not just change our future, but the way we look at life now. During April we will have a sermon series on 1 John looking at the Resurrection Reality.

Grenada Update from Rachel Ihlenfeldt

Dear Members of Morrison Zion,

How do you celebrate the 4th of July? Vivid images of a weekend spent camping, grilling hotdogs and hamburgers, watching fireworks, and attending parades probably just sprung to mind. Not surprisingly, celebrating at school was not a part of your list. Independence Day typically marked the middle of summer for me. The past school year had faded from memory, and the next school year was too far away to start thinking about, although it always came remarkably fast after that...

Grenada's Independence Day is on February 7th, so celebrations are an integral part of school culture. This year is Grenada's 50th anniversary, their Golden Jubilee, and we had a blast celebrating at Grace Lutheran school! The students decked themselves out in their red, green, and gold for National Colours Day, enjoyed a traditional Grenadian breakfast of saltfish souse, bakes, and cocoa tea, and performed songs, dances, and poetry that reflected their national pride and heritage. All of the school children nationwide learned this year's theme song "Up From Here" which highlighted the important pieces of their culture and past while sharing their vision for the future.

Grenada's past is rich in culture, and their celebrations reflected many aspects of it. The weeks before and after have included displays of folktales and storytelling, traditional dancing, drumming, and music, carnival characters who portray costumes and remembrances of Africa and slavery, and military parades recalling their colonial past. They looked back on their blessings, thanking God for preserving them as a nation for the past 50 years and asking God to be with them for the next 50.

Throughout the celebrations, I have been reflecting in a similar way: simultaneously looking back at the past and forward to the future. I don't have 50 years of history to recall, but my past year and a half here surely has been eventful. I have enjoyed numerous opportunities to share God's Word and lead within the congregation; I have found myself in situations that have forced me to grow as a professional and as a called worker, and I have been blessed with the support from here as well as continued support from back home. I am so grateful for both the congregation members at my church in Morrison as well as the children in its school. I was overjoyed and humbled by your generosity you shared in the collection for the children with special needs' gift drive last December and the mission offerings the students collected in their 2nd quarter. Your gifts have touched the hearts of many children in need here and will continue to help share the love of Jesus through our mission at Grace. Thank you for your generosity and prayers of support!

As my time in Grenada comes to a close, I look forward to serving in a new ministry and a new setting. I am returning my name to the Assignment Committee so that I may receive an assignment on Call Day. I will be moving back to the States in May, Lord willing, to wherever I have been called. I look forward to the next few months as I wrap up my time in Grenada. I pray that God uses me effectively to fulfill the church and school's missions to the best of my ability before I am sent to a new congregation.
