l do. You watch. We talk. l do. You help. We talk. You do. I help. We talk. You do. I watch. We talk. You do. Someone else watches.

Doing something new can feel daunting and intimidating. You might feel pressure that you will make a mistake and feel embarrassed. It's hard to do anything you've never been taught or trained to do. How many of you feel able and equipped to fix your own car? If you haven't learned from someone and developed the skills, you won't do it or have the desire to. What child would go play a basketball game in front of hundreds of people for their school without first practicing and being trained by a coach on what to do and how to play the game? Practice and training make us prepared and confident.

Morrison Zion and the body of Christ has been blessed with so many gifted and talented people (Romans 12 and 1 Corinthians 12). Yet there are many things that can hold people back from service. One way to help people be more able to serve is to improve how we recruit and train people. So often people become overwhelmed and burned out. They might be the only ones serving in that capacity. No one else is trained to do what they do. Then when that person announces they are done serving, it is the job of the church to find someone to replace them. There is often little or no training and little or no work between the previous volunteer and the next. How can this be im-

If you look at Jesus and his disciples, Jesus modeled not only how recruiting and development occurs but also how responsibility is transferred. Jesus rarely did the work of the ministry by Himself. Jesus spent time alone, but when He ministered to people, His disciples were always nearby. Early on, they listened and watched Jesus, but soon He asked them to serve and sent them out first as the 12 and then 72 (Luke 9 & 10). Jesus then flipped things around and asked them to serve while He observed and helped. Jesus was preparing his disciples for when he would no longer be physically present. Jesus was sharing the work and empowering them to be confident in their work.

What if in our service at Morrison Zion we were more intentional about how we recruited and trained others to do different acts of service and love? What if we were able to train people in a way they felt confident and prepared. What if as soon as you began serving you would start training others. More people would be equipped to serve and less people would be overwhelmed. The following approach can help recruit and train for service:

- I do. You watch. We talk.
- 2. I do. You help. We talk.
- 3. You do. I help. We talk.
- 4. You do. I watch. We talk.
- 5. You do. Someone else watches.

This approach has been employed for training people to do livestreaming. It has enabled more people to become comfortable in something they had never done. Using this method new people have trained others. To start is easy. Just watch and learn. Consider how you serve. Who could you train to help you do what you do? What can you learn from someone else?

4K and 5K Mrs. Geidel

I cannot believe we are already into March. We have been having so much fun this year and learning and growing in all areas. This month in Religion we will learn about some Parables that Jesus told, and we will learn about Zacchaeus which is always a fun one for the kids. At the end of the month, we will begin the journey to the cross with a lesson on Palm Sunday. In reading class, the 5K students will be working with CVC words that have an o and a u in the middle of them. The 4K students will learn the letters Qq, Rr, Ss, and Tt. In math, the 5K students will learn to count numbers to 100 and begin to learn to identify and describe shapes. Our 4K students will be learning how to compare numbers to 10, such as greater or less than. They will also begin their unit on patterns and different pattern types. In social studies, the 5K students will wrap up their unit on Then and Now and begin their unit on their community. In science, the 5K students will begin the final unit on animals and learn all about God's creation. At the end of February and beginning of March we will celebrate Read Across America week. Each day we will read a book and do a special activity to celebrate. Then we will have a party for Dr. Seuss. Blessings to you all from 4K and 5K!

Grades 1-2 Mrs. Kuchenbecker

The first and second graders studied light and sound in science. They experimented with vibration to make sound with cup phones. They learned about shadows and the difference between opaque, transparent, and translucent. They began a unit on American symbols and patriotism in social studies. We studied the history of Israel as they entered the promised land with God's amazing help. We did art projects based on children's book illustrators and learned about drawing faces. We worked with place value, addition and subtraction, adjectives, contractions, long vowels, and cursive handwriting. We enjoyed dressing up for spirit week. Some of the students have completed one round on our FARM reading challenge. Ask them, they'll tell you all about it. We had lots of fun putting on our class play 3 of a Kind with the third and fourth graders.
