## **Five Essentials of Team**

Over the last few months, you may have see in the Leadership Team notes that that we have been discussing a book called "The Five Dysfunctions of a Team" by Patrick Lencioni. How can this book be helpful to Christians? As Christians we are called to work together in many aspects of life: in family, in work, at school, and in the church. 12 Just as a body, though one, has many parts, but all its many parts form one body, so it is with Christ. <sup>13</sup> For we were all baptized by one Spirit so as to form one body. (1 Corinthians 12:12-13) As we continue with Merge for Mission it can be helpful to consider how we can serve best as a team/the body of Christ looking to give God glory in all we do. In the book Lencioni identifies five components of a highly functioning team that each build off of each other like a pyramid (see the bottom right):

- 1. TRUST: Trust is the foundation of well-functioning teams. *Trust flows out of love for Christ and for others*. It creates a culture of openness and vulnerability. When people trust, they share opinions and feelings, confident they will be respected and heard. Trust enables people to delegate tasks knowing things will get done. While trust flows from love, it is nurtured by respect for others, effective communication, acknowledgment of personal limitations and/or failures, and follow-through on commitments made and jobs undertaken.
- 2. HEALTHY CONFLICT: Many people assume any conflict is bad, but healthy conflict is not only good it is necessary for a healthy team. Healthy conflict flows out of trust and recognizes that when there are issues, team members, out of respect for one another, listen to one another. Teams need to consider and value different perspectives. Christians can respectfully disagree with one another as they discuss issues and work toward solutions. But when leaving the discussion, they leave loving one another and united around a plan for moving foreword.
- 3. COMMITMENT: Well-functioning ministry teams and churches are committed to clear core values, causes, and a vision for ministry. Members are committed to prep up, show up, and step up. But individuals also support team decisions even when


they disagree with the solution--unless there is something morally wrong with the decision (cf. Acts 5:29). Anything less undermines trust and creates confusion, conflict, and lack of confidence in a ministry.

- 4. ACCOUNTABILITY: "Who am I to hold someone accountable?" is often the thought Christion team members believe when it comes to accountability. Jesus tells us to deal with ourselves before dealing with others (Matthew 7:3). But he doesn't say that in Christion love we should never hold one another accountable. Such accountability, while it keeps the sinful nature in check, is an encouragement to the new person within. Accountability shows value to the person and the task. It is important to keeping things on track and getting things done. It builds team trust!
- 5. ATTENTION TO RESULTS: So much in ministry is unseen. The Holy Spirit works through Word and sacrament in souls. But where the Spirit works, we can see people walking with the Spirit in worship, spiritual growth activities, service, fellowship, and godly living. Some of these things we can measure to gauge effectiveness of our efforts--what to keep doing, stop doing, or start doing. What we measure and track is a reflection of what we see as important to our ministry and vision.

Understanding these 5 Essentials can be very beneficial to a team, church, friendships, and family. Much of the book considers what happens when these essentials are missing. Consider how when trust is lost in

a relationship, conflict is avoided or toxic. Christians know we are loved by Jesus and forgiven. So we can love and forgive, treat others with respect, and seek unity in Christ.
