Opportunities of Involvement in Merge for Mission

Immanuel Shirley, voted on April 28 to move forward to Phase 2 of the Merge for Mission program. We have not voted to merge but to take the next steps in planning. Our current vision is that of a muli-site merger of one united ministry with two locations. The leaders of both congregations recently met to learn more about Phase 2 – The Envisioning Phase. In this phase the conversation starts to set out formal plans of what a merger of the two congregations might look like. This phase gives an opportunity for members of our congregation to be involved in a number of committees. While the Executive Committee which will guide the work and determine exactly which committees they feel are needed, here is a snapshot of some of the committees typically involved in this phase along with a brief description of the work of each committee.

Property Subcommittee – This group is responsible for studying the property and facilities at each location. They might report on the size of the property and facilities; study and share the potential sale value of the property, facility, and any equipment at all locations; note and report any needed maintenance; study and report on traffic patterns; etc. Ultimately, they are compiling a report on the strengths and weaknesses of the location and facilities of each congregation. This is an opportunity for anyone who had interest/talents in real estate and/or property valuation to serve.

Finance Subcommittee – This group is responsible for studying and producing a report about the assets and debts of each congregation. The Finance Committee also produces a report summarizing how each church approaches called worker and staff compensation and makes recommendations for compensation guidelines in the merged entity. If you have talents/interest in finances, this is an opportunity for you to serve.

Human Resource Subcommittee – This group is responsible for interviewing all called workers and staff that would be affected by any partnership, merger, or consolidation that might result. The HR Committee would want to determine how all staff feels about the potential merger. Do

Both congregations, Morrison Zion and nanuel Shirley, voted on April 28 to they want to participate in the merger? If they want to participate, how do they see their skills and interests slotting into the new ministry efforts?

School Subcommittee - Since the thought of an early childhood ministry (ECM) is one of the big points of discussion in this merger idea, this committee will be an important part. They will work with advisors from the WELS Commission on Lutheran Schools to determine what the ECM and a joint school might look like. They will have to determine tuition/funding models as part of their vision for the school portion of the merge. This committee will help build community and buy in for the elementary school and ECM at each congregation. This committee is an opportunity to serve for those who desire to help shape the future of Christian education in the merged entity.

Governance Subcommittee – If the resulting partnership is a legal merger, it requires setting up a transition governance group. This committee works with the congregational leadership to plan that transition. It also works on producing an updated (or new) congregational constitution. If you have an interest in governance or legal matters, this is your opportunity to serve.

Ministry Subcommittee – This is the committee that produces a two-to-five year ministry plan. It includes long-range components: mission statement, core values, vision. This committee also works with called workers to work towards a unified philosophy of ministry. If you do well in planning a vision for an organization or working on a long range plan or its components, this would be a place for you to serve.

If you are interested in possibly serving on one of these committees, please speak to Pastor Enderle or Randy Loppnow by July 15.

This phase allows the members of each congregation to give grassroots input on shaping how we envision that the merger might look. We ask you to prayerfully look at the gifts God has given you and see if you might serve a particular committee.

Annual Meeting April 28, 2024

The voters approved the fiscal 2024-2025 budget along with the 2024-2035 High School Goal. Copies of the budget are available in the church basement.

The voters approved moving to Phase 2 with Merge for Missions. Immanuel Shirley held their voters meeting the same day and also approved moving to Phase 2. The Leadership Teams from both congregations will be meeting with the synod on May 28th. More communication on the committees needed and next steps will be coming in the weeks ahead.

The 2024-2025 Leadership Team consisting of Randy Loppnow, Erv Zeamer, Steve Laabs, Kurt Voster, Kris Scheider, Ben Evenson, and Jeff Krueger was approved by the voters. Dennis Griepentrog was approved as the new member on school board.

We thank Hans Herzog, Charles Edinger, and Kurt Heling for their faithful service.

Committee Reports were shared from the various areas of ministry. What a blessing to have so many members serving in many different capacities.

We discussed the opportunity to review worship service times for the summer. After speaking with Immanuel it had been determined that we will not change times for this summer.

May Leadership Team Meeting - May 21, 2024

Our priority was to review the options for the teacher vacancy we currently have. The Commission on Lutheran Schools had provided the School Board with a few names of qualified individuals that we could call as an emergency teacher for 1 year. The school board had the recommendation to place a call to one of these candidates. The Leadership team approved this recommendation. If the Lord has them return the call they presented 3 additional options-call a under grad from MLC for a year, look for retired teachers from the area that may be willing to share duties, the last option would be to restructure the classrooms. Know that God will provide us what we need.

We received word that we will not be receiving a seminary graduate for the 2nd pastor. Calls dates are approximately 6 weeks out. Please watch for future updates on when our next call meeting will be.

The election of the officers was held. Randy Loppnow was elected President, Erv Zeamer was elected Vice President/Secretary and Steve Laabs was elected Treasurer.

Ministry Focus documents continue to be worked on. This is helping us to create 1-3-5-10

year plans in the different areas of our ministry.

We discussed moving to the new hymnal. Our thoughts are to possibly role this out in fall. Pastor Enderle will be getting the quote for hymnals and the service builder. We will review this information in the June meeting.

Leadership Team installation was set for June 30, 2024 during the 10:30 service.

Due to the sever weather predictions we table some items until next month to get the members home safely to their families.

It is Reminder that you can purchase Scrip throughout the summer by contacting Rhonda Heling at 920-676-6277 or catch her in church. You are welcome to drop off orders at school also and Nancy will contact Rhonda that your order was dropped off. Remember that June 30th is the end of Scrip program being applied to the 2024-2025 school year. Starting July 1st any Scrip purchased will go towards the 2025-2026 school year.

You are able to find order forms in the church basement or at school. Another easy way to use the program is with the RaiseRight app. This is the most cost efficient for both you and the church. E-cards ad reloadable cards can be used instantly! They also run specials and bonuses that you will be notified of only through the app. The sign-up code is LCE5EE7B2774L.

Our order form has many retailers but a full list can be found at www.glscrip.com. The credits earned by the purchase of Scrip are split 50/50; one half of the revenue will stay in the Scrip program for expenses and distribution to MZLC and one half will be credited to a families tuition account.

EXAMPLE: The revenue from Kwik Trip is 4%. The purchase of \$100 of Kwik Trip. Scrip will generate \$4.00 in revenue. \$2.00 would be credited to the families account and \$2.00 would go the needs of MZLC scrip program and church.

As a grandparent, can I earn tuition credits for my grandchildren(s) family? As a member of church, you can also give your credit towards a family with children attending Morrison Zion School. Yes, fill out an enrollment form and designate which family you would like the revenue to be credited to. When filling out an enrollment form please check one of the options listed at the bottom of the form.



Call Day Thoughts from an MLC Graduate

We have heard updates from Morrison Zion member and Morrison Zion Lutheran School graduate Rachel Ihlenfeldt from her time serving in Grenada. This month she shares with us what it is like returning to Martin Luther College to receive a call on Call Day.

Call Day is a part of Commencement at MLC when all of the eligible teachers receive their first assignments in the public ministry. But it is so much more than that. Call Day is the culmination of 4 or 5 years of studying and preparing for ministerial work. It is a day of suspense and anticipation, as you wait to hear where God, working through the Assignment Committee, wants you to serve. It is more than just that excitement of getting your first job out of college. It is when you get to cry like the prophet Isaiah, "Here am I. Send me!" and God answers.
