God's Word is like Hard Candy

Have you ever struggled with understanding the Bible? The truths of God's word are clear: God is the creator of all things, and out of love, He sent his Son, Jesus, to die for the sins of the world, including you. Yet, there are times you might read God's word and struggle with its meaning. You might struggle applying the law to yourself and this world. You might also struggle trusting God and his love in a difficult world.

God's word is not just about heaven. Yes, the goal and our certain hope is eternal life with God. But the Bible is relevant, here and now. It helps our lives at work, at home, at school, and everywhere. God's word helps us with our spiritual lives but also helps us be emotionally healthy. The Bible has been described as an ocean with a beach, shallow enough for a child to wade in but deep enough to explore our whole lives.

While God's word is like the ocean, it is also like hard candy. What happens when you are in a hurry to eat hard candy? You chomp on it, it can hurr your teeth, and you don't get much out of it. But what if you have the time to savor it? You get to enjoy the flavor over a long time. In our busy lives, we can forget to take time for God's word but even when we do, at church or at home, we might be rushed and unfocused. You hear the words but don't savor it. Maybe we are emotionally of physically tired. Are you getting the most out of the depths of God's word?

This was the topic of the September Cross-Train Conference that I attended last week. 12 pastors gathered together in northern Minnesota and spent hours delving into the book of Proverbs. Proverbs tells us the difference between knowledge and wisdom. There are two important aspects for a Christian. The first is gaining knowledge about God. We learn about who God is and what his will is for us in the Bible. But gaining knowledge is only a part of it. True wisdom is apply that knowledge in our everyday lives. You might know what God wants you to do. But it is hard to practice it. Do you know what God says is true? But it is hard to believe it and apply it when it matters.

"Proverbs is a very different book. It calls us to study, to think, to learn the practical discipline of centering all our thoughts and actions on God. Indeed, one of the main messages of Proverbs is-you've never really thought enough about anything." (God's Wisdom for Navigating Life, Timothy Keller)

This is the whole focus of the CrossTrain Pastoral Coaching program. CrossTrain was developed by WELS pastors and counselors to help pastor stay spiritual, emotional, and physically healthy. Why is this important? They saw a dangerous trend of burnout or blowups that led to the end of ministries, usually caused by not being spiritually, emotionally, or physically healthy. These burnouts or blowups caused great problems to their flock and the kingdom as a whole. When a pastor can be healthy in these areas, and learn ways to model it and teach it to their congregations, then you have more and more Christians who are learning how to apply the great gospel truths of scripture to all areas of life. Our world has an emotional health crisis. You or someone you know, might be struggling. Counseling and medication is necessary at times. The hard candy of God's word can help many find true peace.

I'll share more of the key parts of Cross-Train education in future months but for now I'll end with a favorite, a resiliency prayer you can say daily. It helps ground you in your identity, *a child of God*. And it helps you face life, understanding many things are out of your control but not out of God's. You can't control other people or every event, but you can control how you react. God makes you a victor not a victim.

Resiliency prayer: Lord, I know that I am loved and forgiven, a precious child of God, bought by the blood of Christ. I know that today events will happen, some good and some bad, some that are in my control but most that aren't. I know that these events will trigger thoughts (why me, this shouldn't happen to me, poor me) and those thoughts will produce feelings that will impact my behavior. So when these events happen help me remember that you have promised to never leave me or forsake me (Hebrews 13) and that you will work it out for my eternal good (Romans 8), so that I can have feelings of hope, peace, confidence, and joy with the goal that my behavior brings you glory in all I say and do. Amen.

4K and 5K are off to a great start this year! We have been working hard on routines this month and are doing great! October brings lots of fun for us. In Bible history we are learning about Joseph, baby Moses, and God choosing Moses through the burning bush. In math, the 5K class will be learning numbers 6 to 10 and how to compare numbers 6 to 10.
