Fall in Love with God's Word

The phone rang in my office. The voice said, "I'm looking for a Lutheran church."

That's a rare thing to hear in Tulsa. My heart raced: "We're a Lutheran church! How can I help you?"

He answered, "I'm looking for a Lutheran church to donate all my Lutheran books."

Huh?

I met with the man and heard his story. He was an atheist for years, but when he decided to study all the maAs Lutherans we value Scripture, but how much time do we really spend reading it?

jor world religions, God used his Word to convince him that Christianity is true. He then began to study Christian denominations: Methodist, Lutheran, Catholic, and Greek Orthodox. He went deep. He ordered and read as many books as he could.

I was amazed. "What do you think of Lutherans?" I asked.

He said, "I loved reading Martin Luther's writings. I have never heard of someone so in love with God's Word. I loved his devotional approach to every part of Scripture and how God's Word was part of his daily life in every way."

"That's great," I said. "So you want to be a Lutheran, right?"

"No," he said. "I don't want to be a Lutheran, because Lutherans aren't like that anymore. The Lutherans I know and the Lutheran churches I've visited aren't like Martin Luther at all. People don't read God's Word anymore. The focus at church seems more like a country club than a church. Lutherans today don't love God's Word like Martin Luther did. So I'm not going to be a Lutheran. I want to donate all my Lutheran books to your

church."

My heart sank. Not just because he wasn't going to join our church but because he was right. At least, he was right about me. His words convicted me because I immediately thought of how little I read the Bible. Of how often I'm too busy doing important pastor things instead of sitting and reading the Word of God. "Lutherans today don't love God's Word like Martin Luther did." That's true for me. Is it true for you?

As we celebrate the Reformation this year, let's go back to our roots. Let's do the most Lutheran thing in the world: Read God's Word! Today. Tomorrow. The next day. Wouldn't it be great if people could describe us like that man described Martin Luther? "I've never seen people so in love with God's Word!"

Of course, that love for the Word did not start with Martin Luther. It's everywhere in the Bible. Read Psalm 119 today. It's long—176 verses! Notice that the author mentions a synonym for God's Word in all the verses except verse 122. God's Word was so precious—so special—to him. "How can a young person stay on the path of purity? By living according to your word. . . . I delight in your decrees; I will not neglect your word" (Psalm 119:9,16). I will not neglect your Word!

In the busyness of life, read God's Word and find God's strength for another day. In the darkness of depression, read God's Word and hear of God's neverending love for you. Under the weight of guilt, read God's Word and remember how the blood of Jesus already forgave you. In the face of death, read God's Word and long for the glory of heaven.

Let's go back to our Lutheran roots. Let's fall in love with God's Word.

Highlights from Leadership Team's October 8, 2024 Meeting

The devotion was based on Psalm 90. For our study we started reviewing the book The *Unity Factor* written by Larry Osborne. It is a book based on helping develop a healthy Leadership Team.

We are working on our Rocks (goals) for the second trimester. Budgeting for 2025-2026 will need to be a part of this for each area of our ministry. This budget needs to be ready for the voters in April. We set a action time to have the Rocks completed by the end October. Once we have them completed we will share with the congregation.

The Leadership Team finalized some changes to the Pastor Job Descriptions and approved. Next step is to present to the congregation for approval. At this time we do not have any date for our the next call meeting.

Early Childhood updates were provided. We will have the open forum on Oct. 27 between services with Ann Potter from WELS to discuss the program and answer questions.

The Leadership Team approved the request from the Cemetery and Grounds Committee to increase the cost for gravesites. This will be presented to the congregation at the next called voters meeting.

Thanksgiving offering will go to the Food Pantry. We also approved applying for the WELS matching grant that is available. This will be announced in the weekly announcements and the newsletter.

We reviewed the wording around the School Endowment Fund. It was decided that this year we move the 2024-2025 gains out of the WELS Investment Fund to a designated funds account so it be used on a school project.

Approval was given to renew the line of credit we have with Greenleaf Bank. While we have been blessed with not using this for a number of years we continue to have it available in the case we would need it in the future.

Grades 7 & 8

Greetings from 7th and 8th grade! What a full fall it has been. We praise God for all that we receive every day. Some of the blessings that we are experiencing currently are an active class of 7th and 8th graders who are motivated to learn and use their gifts to the fullest! Recently we have been showcasing these gifts in our preparation for our play performance on November 1st. We were thankful for the opportunity to look to "Alice in Wonderland" performed by FVL as an example. In religion class, the 7th and 8th graders have been going through the topical Christ Light curriculum, "What Do I Say Lord?" We look at how Christians respond to situations such as: when a loved on dies or when someone is struggling with their faith.
