**Early Childhood Ministry Update** 

On September 27, presentations were held at both Morrison Zion and Immanuel Shirley. Ann Potter, a WELS consultant with 23 years of experience at 5 star childcare center helped with these presentations. their school and built an addition. Howev-Ann Potter has been helping the Early Child Committee sharing great wisdom and guidance to our project and planning. You can watch the open forum / presenta-

tion given at Morrison and download the presentation by scanning the QR code. Below is a summary of that presentation and some planning.



Ann began by sharing the two questions she asks as a consultant when working with a congregation.

- 1) Is Early Childhood Ministry good for your community?
- 2) Is Early Childhood Ministry (ECM) a good fit for your congregation?

If the answer to those two questions is yes, then how do you make an ECM happen? Ann takes joy in helping make sure an ECM is setup well and runs well. Through the work of the ECM Committee and the help of Mrs. Potter we believe the answer to these questions are "yes." Some of the reasons why it is a good fit includes the blessings of an ECM. Blessings of an ECM:

- Alternative to knocking on doors to do outreach in your community
- Caring for children earns trust and builds relationships.
- Earning the privilege to share Jesus with children and families
- Opens doors for baptisms, new membership classes, and getting families into worship
- Can be a financial blessing which enables other ministries to grow

Most importantly: Children are hearing about Jesus

- Children will share with each other and with their families
- Families will want to continue Christian Education
- Families will want to continue hearing about Jesus too

Why now? Morrison Zion School Board has had exploring an ECM on its objectives for over 10 years. Immanuel Shirley has discussed this idea ever since they closed er, until 2023 the two churches have not discussed how we could work together to have an ECM.

What is needed for an ECM? Facility, Staff, Cost, Equipment.

Previous obstacles. The facilities, staffing and cost have all been large obstacles to making an ECM happen. Morrison on it's own would have to build on at high costs. With a teacher shortage, it could be hard to fill positions.

**Obstacles removed.** By working with Immanuel Shirley, their existing classrooms can be the ECM, which decreases start up costs significantly. Danielle Ripp, a member at Zion, is currently taking classes to become a synod certified teacher and ECM director. She would be eligible for a call in 2025.

**Potential Plans and Timeline.** The ECM committee is presenting a plan to open the ECM in August of 2025 to go with the 25/26 school year. These plans are be presented in detail to the leadership teams at Zion and Shirley. The plan is to have a congregational vote to approval on January 28 at both congregations. An open forum would be held on January 14. By working with Shirley the start up costs have been reduced to around \$25,000 (very low for start up and shared with Shirley). If approved, a call would be issued early in 2025 for a ECM director (Danielle Ripp is a possible candidate). Preliminary budgets with varied number of students and possible donations have been created. With these preliminary plans and budgets the ECM could be self-sufficient with about 9-11 students, ages 30-months up to 4K.

#### Highlights from November Leadership Team Highlight

The Leadership Team met November 19, 2024

Devotions was based on Hebrews 13. For our study we reviewed chapters 2 and 3 of The Unity Factor written by Larry Osborne. It is a book based on helping develop a healthy Leadership Team. These chapters talk about removing roadblocks and guarding the gate.

Rocks (goals) have been established for the second trimester. For this trimester we have 20 Rocks established for the different areas of our ministry.

Mr. Geidel set up a shared drive and generic email addresses for all LT members. We plan to start having all documentation online.

Small Group Bible Studies are going well. They will resume in January. There is a potential of starting a fourth group. Church attendance and Bible Study attendance has gone up the past few months with the start of school.

We adopted changes to the Good Samaritan fund to allow

up to \$200 with the Pastor and 2 of the 3 (President, Vice President/Secretary, Treasurers) approval.

Discussion regarding the budget and financial stewardship were had.

Reports were reviewed. The LT approved Pro1 for snow removal for this upcoming winter season. We will be looking for sidewalk shovelers!

The Early Childhood Committee has not met since the last LT meeting. They will be getting together to put together all needed information to bring to the voters in January. At that meeting we plan to look for approval to start this program. We will do an open forum 2 weeks prior to the vote to share this information with the congregation.

The LT received Jason and Macey Schiesl into membership.

Voters meeting is set for December 1 to call a second pastor. We will look to approve the revised Pastor Job Descriptions at this meeting. Copies of the revised job descriptions will be available starting this week.

## Unifying for Ministry

Subcommittees continue to meet to discuss the work that Immanuel Shirley and Morrison Zion can do together to further the gospel. These committees are meeting regularly to answer many questions about what this joint ministry work can look like and considering the blessings and challenges . Early in 2025 the executive committee will meet again to review their findings.
