On September 27, 2024 presentations were held at both Morrison Zion and Immanuel Shirley by the ECM (Early Child Ministry) Committees with the help of a

WELS Consultant Ann Potter. You can watch that open forum and see the presentation by scanning the QR Code or going to mzluth.org.



During that open forum and in the December newsletter some projected budget numbers were shared along with a timeline. The ECM Committee has requested another open forum for January 12, 2025 with a voters meeting on January 26 to approve the ECM plans. Please join these meetings and continue to bring any questions you may have to the ECM Committee members and chairs.

To share some more on how an Early Child Ministry can be a beneficial ministry here is an except from *Building Blocks*, a handbook from WELS on ECMs.

Early Childhood Ministry Philosophy

God specifically gives parents the primary responsibility for nurturing their children. Christian early childhood ministries provide for the Christian nurturing of young children, a vital aspect of the mission of the church. This unique ministry strives to meet the spiritual, social, emo-

Think About It—God gives parents the primary responsibility for nurturing their children

tional, cognitive, and physical needs of young children in a developmentally appropriate manner.

Parents specifically have been given this responsibility.

Scripture identifies the family as our first and most enduring relationship. It teaches that children are a "heritage from the Lord" (*Children are a heritage from the Lord,* offspring a reward from him. Psalm 127:3) and that God gives parents the direction to "bring them up in the training and instruction of the Lord" (*Fathers, do not exasper*ate your children; instead, bring them up in the training and instruction of the Lord. *Ephesians 6:4*). Christian early childhood ministries will encourage and assist parents in meeting their responsibilities toward their children and it will endeavor to emphasize the joys of taking these privileges to heart.

Christian early childhood ministries support parents in carrying out this responsibility.

Christian early childhood programs are ministries to children and parents. They are carried out with an awareness of the family setting and are responsive to the needs of the family. From the time of the child's birth, early childhood ministries work directly with parents in providing materials, activities, and training in the privilege of being their child's most important teacher. When the parent enrolls the child in an agency of the congregation, this ministry includes the child directly as well as the

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of young children

parent. Parents are included in this training and instruction of the Lord by involving them meaningfully and appropriately in the activities of the ECM.

The mission of the church is to make disciples.

The church carries out its various forms of ministry for the sake of and by the command of Christ to "Therefore go and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit" (Matthew 28:19). This disciple making includes the two complementary tasks of reaching out to the unbeliever and nurturing the faith of the believer. Children are particularly included as Peter told the crowd on Pentecost, "the promise is for you and your children and for all who are far off-for all whom the Lord our God will call" (Acts 2:39). Thus, the Christian early childhood ministry of a congregation will include both outreach and nurture in its program and policies.

December Leadership Team Highlights

The Leadership Team met on December 17, 2024

Devotions were based on Hebrews 10. We then reviewed Chapters 4 and 5 of the Unity Factor. The chapters focused on traits for a Leadership Team and the role of the Pastor.

We spent a good amount of time discussing the Early Childhood Ministry plan so that we are prepared to present to the congregation in January. We are putting together the agenda for the open forum that will be held prior to voting on starting this program. The presentation will include why this ministry is important to Zion and Immanuel and what a budget to run the program would look like.

We have the call extended to Pastor Lindke to serve as our second pastor. Encouraged members of the LT to reach out to him as he deliberates the call.

Financial reports were reviewed and approved.

Parsonage Allowance for called workers for 2025 were set and approved.

The Fair Market Value for the parsonage and teacherage for tax year 2025 was approved at \$14,400.

We approved the following financial policies required to document our processes. This is required for the School Choice Program. - Activity Level Controls – Receipts

1. Describes how we collect, record, reconcile, and report donations.

- Activity Level Controls – AP Disbursements

1. This describes how we get approvals and pay bills

- Activity Level Controls – Payroll

1. This describes how we process payroll

- Activity Level Controls – Electronic Payments

1. This describes who has a debit and credit card and how they are used.

The LT approved spending up to \$ 1100 to move our bookkeeping systems to an online version that allows more than 1 person to access the records. The plan is to work on this in January.

Approval was given to proceed with the HVAC units for the 2 classrooms in the oldest part of school. The funds from School Endowment and a donation by members will cover the cost of this project.

Rocks were reviewed for this trimester. We have not had much traction at this time.

Membership transfers approved included Evan Soderlund to St. Pauls, Green Bay, WI and Leah Nushart to Trinity Lutheran, Aberdeen, SD.

Worship In January

In January we begin the Epiphany season. "Epiphany" comes from a Greek word that means "reveal." When someone has an epiphany, it's not that reality changed. The way they see that reality is what changed, for a deeper truth has been revealed. An epiphany is an "a-ha!" moment causing us to look at things very differently.

In the Church Year, Epiphany is the season where we see Jesus begin his ministry, revealing the reason the Son of God came to earth. In this season we will come to understand that when we have Jesus in our lives, it does not always mean our reality drastically changes. It simply means that we see reality differently (and better). Jesus always provides an abundance of epiphany moments.

4K and 5K

Wheww! December was busy but so much fun! The students had a great time singing Rudolph at our Christmas presentation and sharing the good news of Jesus' birth on Christmas Eve. We are well rested after break and ready to go for January. This month in Bible we will learn all about Jesus. We will learn about his baptism, first miracle, and his miracle of catching many fish. In math the kindergarten class will work more with addition

and subtraction and begin our unit on numbers to 20. Preschool will learn how to identify, create, and extend AB patterns. In reading the kindergarten class will learn some new tricky words such as I, are, and little and will work in spelling words. The preschoolers will learn letters K, J, L and M and will continue to learn all about animals. God has given the church the responsibility to assist parents in training the young.

The Old Testament often describes how the community of believers, the church, instructed and trained children (All the men of Judah, with their wives and children and little ones, stood there before the LORD 2 Chronicles 20:13; And on that day they offered great sacrifices, rejoicing because God had given them great joy. The women and children also rejoiced. The sound of rejoicing in Jerusalem could be heard far away. Nehemiah 12:43). Our Lord gave a specific command to the church to nurture children in his words to Peter, "Feed my lambs" (John 21:15). The church has historically established agencies for the education of the young. Christian early childhood ministries are now a growing part of that rich tradition. The church meets this responsibility when its programs encourage and support parents in their Godgive obligations and help children grow as disciples of Jesus Christ.

Christian training is necessary for young children.

By precept and example the Bible speaks to the necessity of Christian training for young children. The need for Christian training is found in the sinful nature of the child (Surely I was sinful at birth, sinful from the time my mother conceived me. Psalm 51:5); the words of our Lord declare that the truths of Scripture can and must be taught to children (Let the little children come to me, and do not hinder them, for the kingdom of God belongs to such as these. Mark 10:14); and the admonition of Proverbs to clearly and directly prescribe training (Start children off on the way they should go, and even when they are old they will not turn from it. Proverbs 22:6). The examples of Samuel (The Lord was with Samuel as he grew up and he let none of his words fall to the ground. I

Samuel 3:19) and Timothy (From infancy you have known the Holy Scriptures, which are able to make you wise for salvation through faith in Christ Jesus. 2 Timothy 3:15) are to be emulated by families and congregations today. The WELS upholds its heritage and clear words of Scripture as it provides for the Christian education of young children. Attitudes,

Christian early childhood ministry is a part of a congregation's ministry to families.

The various agencies of Christian education (e.g. childcare, preschool, Sunday School, the Lutheran elementary school, and youth ministries) have a cooperative focus to support and reinforce the goals of Christian outreach and nurture, particularly as parents and teachers share these goals. Early childhood education should be one strand of the congregations' approach to Christian education. Under God's blessings this ministry will serve to nurture the home-church partnership by being a means to strengthen the relationship of the family with the Savior.

Christian early childhood ministries foster the development of the whole child.


A developmentally appropriate program will recognize that young children are holistic learners. Motor skill learning, social learning, intellectual learning, emotional learning, and the learning of spiritual truths are interrelated. Useful learning activities in early childhood education are not compartmentalized by subjects: likewise, a scriptural viewpoint permeates all learning experiences. A Christian early childhood education ministry is truly Christian when that program finds its integration and correlation in God's messages of sin and grace. These programs should allow children to understand sin, to experience repentance and forgiveness, and to share with and care for others. Children will learn of Jesus their Savior, they will learn stories and teachings of Scripture, and they will experience the joy and privilege of sharing their Savior with others.

Young children learn through play.

Early childhood programs involve children as active learners by providing them with play experiences that help them learn. Play enables children to pass through the stages of development by interacting with activities and materials that are concrete, real, and relevant to their young lives. Play as a child-initiated and child-directed activity is a vital component for establishing a foundation for learning. It is important that parents and teachers provide encouragement and facilitate quality play activities, model purposeful types of play, and appropriately participate in the child's play.
