Encouraged

Therefore, brothers and sisters, in all our distress and persecution we were encouraged about you because of your faith. For now we really live, since you are standing firm in the Lord. How can we thank God enough for you in return for all the joy we have in the presence of our God because of you? (1 Thessalonians 3:7-9)

Encouraged. Is that how you feel today? Encouraged? Probably not. There is so much in life that leaves us feeling discouraged. The day hardly ever goes the way you planned it in the morning. Even the simplest things somehow manage to be difficult. Are you feeling more discouraged than encouraged?

Paul understands. Nothing in his life went according to his plans, especially as he traveled around as a missionary. It wasn't his plan to face a riot in Thessalonica and be forced to flee. His life was filled with distress and persecution. How does that sound? Discouraging.

Except, Paul wasn't discouraged. On the contrary, he said he was "encouraged." How? Well, he writes, "in all our distress and persecution we were encouraged about you because of your faith....How can we thank God enough for you in return for all the joy we have in the presence of our God because of you?"

Can you tell what encouraged Paul? Other Christians did. When he felt distressed, it was other Christians who encouraged him in his faith in Jesus. When he felt all alone, it was other Christians who encouraged him through their faith in Jesus. When he felt depressed, it was other Christians who encouraged him with the joy that comes from Jesus. That's how he was encouraged: By his brothers and sisters in Christ.

God wants to encourage you in the very same way. When you feel distressed or depressed or alone, what do you do? I bet I can guess. I bet you separate yourself from other people. You stop going to church. You stay by yourself. Does that encourage you? I don't think so! Realize this: When you're feeling down, it's the devil who wants to separate you from the encouragement of God's people.

Instead, God wants to build you up through the encouragement of his people and the Word and the works of the body of Christ. Tragedies and disasters are daily occurrences. Car accidents shock and cancer strikes. Your church is here to give extra help and listen.

When you're discouraged, make time for church. Go to a Bible study. Call a Christian friend. Talk to your pastor. The church, all of its members are here to support you physically, spiritually, and emotionally. Witness the faith of a brother or sister in Christ. Know how you'll feel? Encouraged.

Dear Lord God, it's easy for me to feel discouraged and separate myself from you and your people. Forgive me! Instead, help me to find encouragement through Christ, other Christians, and their faith in you. In Jesus' name, amen.

January Leadership Team Highlights

The Leadership Team met on January 21, 2025

Devotions were based on Psalm 146. For our study we reviewed chapters 6 and 7 of the Unity Factor. Discussion was in regards to training Leaders.

On our list of open action items we are looking to: - Implement a review process for staffed positions list Secretary, Custodian, etc.

- Update the Wish List and have a process to continuously update the list.

We set a Voters Call Meeting date for February 23, 2025. We will look to call a second pastor and to place a permanent call to Mrs. Richter. Last vear we had called her for a 1 year emergencv call.

Discussion was had regarding the structure of the LT for 2025-2026. We will continue to have 7 serving and will look to have one of the seven focus on a new joint ministry with Immanuel. We will discuss nominees at our next meeting.

Budget planning for 2025-2026 will begin. Areas of the ministry need to have their information to Steve by Feb.18th so he can compile some data for the Feb. LT meeting. The budget committee will meet on March 10.

Randy will have Tony review the HVAC maintenance program. We currently are using 4 different companies.

The LT reviewed the proposal from a family that would like to

install a stained glass window insert over the double doors at the front entrance. This will be paid for with memorial money from the family. It was designed around matching our current windows. The LT approved the proposal.

Discussion was had regarding the School Boards recommendation on changing the times for the children's Christmas Eve services. They will get a few questions that came up answered and the LT will discuss at the February meeting.

For membership changes the LT granted the Evenson family, Ben, Erica, Arabella, and Braxton a transfer to St. Johns, Wrightstown.

Synod Missions goal for 2025 we set at \$ 30,000. This is less than last year but is closer to the amount given in 2024.

A Unifying Ministry timeline was shared. The first Executive Committee meeting will be in February. The plan is still to the ECM program as this will be have this ready for a vote in January 2026 on the joining of the two congregations.

Worship In February

In February we continue the Epiphany season. "Epiphany" comes from a Greek word that means "reveal." When someone has an epiphany, it's not that reality changed. The way they see that reality is what changed, for a deeper truth has been revealed. An epiphany is an "a-ha!" moment causing us to look at things very differently.

In the Church Year, Epiphany is the season where we see Jesus begin his ministry, revealing the reason the Son of God came to earth. In this season we will come to understand that when we have Jesus in our lives, it does not always mean our reality drastically changes. It simply means that we see reality differently (and better). Jesus always provides an abundance of epiphany moments.
