Lead Yourself - Part 1

A child comes home from school and tells his parents, "I'm in charge of me." His parents are at first shocked, but then they ask more. The child goes on to explain. The child's preschool teacher makes a huge deal out of that statement. The teacher cannot make a child pick up his toys after he's finished playing with them. She cannot force a child to eat his food. She cannot keep a child from hitting a classmate for calling him a name. While this concept might seem strange or shocking at first, it is such an important concept to know. No one can make you do anything.

"I have recalled that conversation so many times because the implication of that truth is so powerful for every one of us. It's not just true for three-year-olds; it's true for thirty-one-year-olds. You are in charge of you. You are in charge of your emotions, your thoughts, your reactions, and your decisions. It's the law of personal responsibility, because everyone is responsible for leading something, even if that something is just you" (*How to Lead When You're Not in Charge*, Scroggins p 92).

Why is this concept important? So often we blame others for the situations we are in. If it's at school, at work, or within your family. It's my parents' fault for being too strict. My boss isn't a good leader, that is why the project failed. If only my teacher would do it this way, then I would be a better student. I am not in control of others. I can't make them do anything. Parents, you can't make your children do things. You can scold and punish, but in the end they need to do it. But you are in charge of your own actions and emotions. You are in charge of how you react to others and the situations you are in.

On Sunday nights we are reading the book *How to Lead When You're Not in Charge*. The author, Clay Scroggins first encourages the reader to examine their identity and priorities.

"Near the core of what makes a person a leader is their sense of identity. The way you see yourself is determinative for your life and for the decisions you make as a leader. Your sense of identity directs you in every situation. It is foundational, determining the level of confidence you have when you challenge your boss in a disagreement. It establishes your sense of security when you face doubts. It's what enables you to process your emotions during tense conversations. Though much of your identity is formed at an early age, your identity is always evolving. So it's never too early or too late to begin processing your sense of self" (p 38).

Do you have a clear understanding of your identity and purpose? As Christians, we have a sure and certain identity that can guide us in every situation of life, no matter what difficulty we are facing. Scroggins writes, "the two truths that have had more impact on my identity than anything else are: **1. Because I have been created in the image of God, I am a chosen child of the King. 2. For God so loved me that Jesus died for me**" (p 51). All of this fits well with the resiliency prayer that has been shared before. It focuses on your identity and what you are in control of and dealing with the things you are not in control of.

Resiliency prayer: Lord, I know that I am loved and forgiven, a precious child of God, bought by the blood of Christ. I know that today events will happen, some good and some bad, some that are in my control but most that aren't. I know that these events will trigger thoughts (why me, this shouldn't happen to me, poor me) and those thoughts will produce feelings that will impact my behavior. So when these events happen help me remember that you have promised to never leave me or forsake me (Hebrews 13) and that you will work it out for my eternal good (Romans 8), so that I can have feelings of hope, peace, confidence, and joy with the goal that my behavior brings you glory in all I say and do, Amen.

In the next part of this series on *Lead Yourself*, we'll look at the four behaviors to help find peace and to be faithful even when you're not in charge. 1) Lead Yourself 2) Choose Positivity 3) Think Critically 4) Reject Passivity. Join us Sunday nights for our book study at 7 p.m. for more on this topic.

The Leadership Team - April 15, 2025

- The devotion was based on John 19:30 - focus on the 3 words - It is Finished.
- For our study we viewed the final chapters of the Unity Factor.
- The Leadership Team had a discussion on onboarding of new members. More discussion to follow.
- The list of elected and nominated positions was reviewed and updated. This will be voted on at the annual meeting on April 27, 2025.
- LT received Kim Kibilowski into membership via transfer from Immanuel - Shirley, WI
- Pastor Enderle shared information regarding the call to serve Truth In Love Ministries in Nampa, ID. Please keep him and his family in your prayers as he deliberates the 2 calls he holds.

It started as an issue with the gym area but upon further investigation Foremans is finding a number of other issues with the boilers. They are 20 years old and may need replacement. We need to review a 3-5 year property needs plan. We plan to act on the gym issue at the voters meeting.

WORSHIP IN MAY

Easter - Because He Lives It is easy to become so engrossed in the details of historical events—who, when, where—that we miss their significance. For example, consider World War II. There are many compelling stories. Lots of dates and data to remember. However, for a moment, set all that aside, and just imagine the Allies had lost. How would the world be different today? What would life be like for those of Jewish heritage? Would freedom exist in Europe? Would we be speaking German? With historical events, you miss out if you focus only on the details: who, when, where. You also need to focus what that historical event means. The Allies won. That means something!



In this season of Easter, it is good we review the details: who, when, where. That reminds us that the resurrection of Christ is not fairytale or fable. It is a historical event. . . the historical event. However, we do ourselves a disservice if we simply recall the historic details of Easter without thinking long and hard about Easter's significance. Jesus won. That means something! It is our privilege and pleasure to use the fifty days of Easter to discuss this fact: because he lives, not only is our eternity secure, but we have abundant resources to face the present.
